

WHAT IS TITLE I?

Title 1 is a federal program that provides funding to local school districts to improve the academic achievement of disadvantaged students, or students who come from low-income families, are in foster homes, are neglected or delinquent, or who live in families receiving government assistance. Schools that qualify for funding are automatically enrolled in the program.

The purpose of Title I is to build and foster the development of a school-parent partnership to help all children achieve the state's high standards.

YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES AS A PARENT ARE:

Ensure your child is at school every day and on time



Attend parent-teacher conferences

Provide your child with a time and place to do homework and see that the homework is completed

Respond to communications from your child's teachers By consistently doing all of the above, we can work together to ensure your child's academic success.

Different grade levels have different needs. Pullout programs and individual instruction usually happens daily in the lower levels. Inclusion or in-class instruction is used in the upper grades with an occasional pullout. This means your child may be receiving extra help in reading and/or math in addition to what his or her classroom teacher is providing.

Marlington Local Schools will serve students with the greatest need in grades k-8 who are struggling in reading and math. Students' progress is monitored regularly. Students who enter the district mid-year will complete the state diagnostic assessment, STAR testing and progress monitoring tools.
