

OPENING 5-20 MINUTES:

NON-NEGOTIABLE

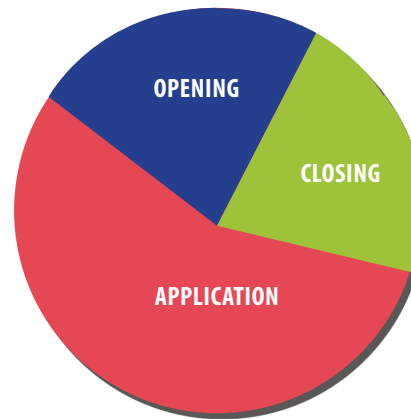
- Set Common Core objectives/learning target for work session
- Review, preview, and/or make connections to real life

EXAMPLES

- Pre-assessment (i.e. entrance tickets, clickers)
- Read aloud
- Pre-reading strategy
- Think aloud
- Demonstrations (i.e. game, skill lesson, reading strategy)
- Modeling skills, the wrong way and the right way
- Video Clips (i.e. Brain Pop, YouTube, etc.)
- Websites



K-5 READING INSTRUCTIONAL FRAMEWORK



CLOSING 5-20 MINUTES:

NON-NEGOTIABLE

- Review Common Core objectives/learning target from opening
- Provide feedback and celebrate progress toward meeting standards
- Assess performance (i.e. formative/summative during application or closing)

EXAMPLES

- Exit ticket
- Work samples
- Dry erase boards
- Brain pop quiz
- Observation records
- Checklists
- Clickers

DUKE TIME 30 MINUTES:

- No new instruction
- RtI district interventions
- Provide intervention and/or enrichment
- Double dose of instruction

APPLICATION/WORK SESSION 30-60 MINUTES:

NON-NEGOTIABLE

- Ultimate goal: Utilize research-based teaching strategies (i.e. Marzano, Blooms Taxonomy, Fountas and Pinnell, etc.)
- K-2 Guided Reading: see all students at least 2 times per week for each group as soon as possible
- 3-5 Guided Reading: see all students at least 1 time per week for each group
- Daily Fluency
- Monitor and document student progress

- Differentiate and present lesson to meet individual learning styles
- Standards and essential questions are incorporated throughout the lesson
- Provide ongoing interventions

ESSENTIALS

- K-5 Daily 5/Centers/Stations
- Conference with students and set individual goals (i.e. AR Goals, Fluency Goals, Dominic Goals, 9 week grade, graph sight words, etc.)

- Instruction is interactive – modeling, demonstrating, guided practice
- Formative/summative assessments

MATERIALS

- SMARTBoard
- Graphic organizers
- iPads and computers
- Leveled books (i.e. Reading A-Z, book room)
- Foundations
- Internet (i.e. YouTube, websites)
